


The following instructions can be used to view the current "General" duty rate for specific 10-digit U.S. HTS numbers.

Go to U.S. Harmonized Tariff Schedule

The default setting will bring you to the "View" tab



From this location you have access to select and view all parts of the U.S. HTS including sections, chapters, chapter/section notes, general notes, rules, appendixes, annexes, and the alphabetic index.

To search for details on a specific HTS number select the "Search" tab.



HTS Search

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From here you can initiate a search based on the 4, 6, 8, or 10-digit level. Considering the 4 and 6 digit levels are universal for all countries we recommend you search at the 4 or 6 digit level and then review the available options at the 8 and 10 digit level.


The required formatting in the search field is as follows; N = number

4 digit level: NNNN 6 digit level: NNNN.NN 8 digit level: NNNN.NN.NN 10 digit level: NNNN.NN.NNNN

Once you have arrived at the 4, 6, 8, or 10-digit level you can find the "General" rate of duty in **Column 1, General**. The general rate of duty is the general duty rate applicable to all country origins, with the exception of North Korea, Cuba, and those countries that may have a free trade agreement or other preferential duty program with the U.S.. See further details below.

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The duty rates shown in **Column 1 "Special"** represent duty rates for countries that have Free trade Agreements or other preferential duty agreements with the U.S. The listing of countries corresponding to country codes shown in this column can be found under **General Note 3(c).**

The duty rates in Column 2 represent the duty rates for goods of Cuba or North Korea origin.

In addition to any applicable duty there would be MPF at 0.3464% subject to minimum of \$27.23 and maximum of \$528.33 per entry (minimum and maximum amounts effective up to Sept. 30, 2021)

If the goods arrive via sea freight then HMF at 0.125% would also apply.

Please be advised that in addition to any applicable general or special duty rate there may be various additional duties based on commodity and/or country of origin. Examples of these may be anti-dumping, counter-veiling, Section 301, Section 232, or Section 201 duties. Contact your Gebrüder Weiss representative if you require guidance in this area.
